Coastal Poodle Rescue rehabilitates abandoned and abused Poodles and Poodle-mixes throughout Florida. When they're ready, we place them in loving homes where they soon become cherished family members.

Our Poodles come from backyard breeders, puppy mills, and animal shelters where they may be euthanized. We are also contacted by owners when they can no longer care for their dogs.

Every dog is examined by a veterinarian, spayed or neutered, and receives all treatments and surgeries he needs. We foster our dogs until they are adopted; we don't euthanize.

Our application and adoption process is thorough. We check veterinary references and interview all applicants in their homes. We only adopt to those that will provide the quality loving home our dogs deserve.

We are a non-profit 501(c)3 organization, so donations are tax deductible. Our funding comes only from YOU, our members. We are all volunteers; your contributions are used for veterinary care.

FEISTY FAUFEE'S JOURNEY

Looking more like a "hairy rat" when rescued in South Florida, Faufee was 2.5 pounds of matted despair. Bad teeth and terribly underweight. Then, at 3.7 pounds, she was vaccinated and had blood tests, which showed she was heartworm positive. This diagnosis was a real blow. Later, at a "huge" 4.5 pounds, she began treatment. She was to be "kept quiet" after her injection --- easier said than done with this little fighter!! A few weeks later, her foster mom found her coughing non-stop with lung congestion from the heartworm die-off. Now it was a matter of life and death. On Sept. 10, she was cleared of heartworms, but her little lungs were still congested. By Sept 24, she was finally cleared by the doc and weighed in at 5 pounds! In late October, she was healthy enough to have her teeth cleaned, and lost 11 of them. Now she was ready for her forever home! Her new family, Bonnie and Joe, came and happily brought her into their hearts. A happy ending for a scrappy survivor, and a valuable lesson. Here in Florida, heartworm is a year-round problem. **Please use preventatives on your pets!**
